PLATFORM-TO-BUSINESS (P2B) ISSUES

- Prohibition of anti-competitive practices: understanding the key competition concerns through EU antitrust case examples (favouring, price-parity clauses, etc.)
- Regulation of transparency and fairness: EU Regulation on fair treatment of business users of online platforms

PLATFORM-TO-CONSUMER (P2C) ISSUES

- Data collection and processing as an abuse of dominance (the Facebook case in Germany)
- Influence of the EU General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR)
- Online sales restrictions and geo-blocking in distribution agreements
- Regulation addressing geo-blocking and other forms of discrimination

DATA CONCENTRATION, SHARING AND GOVERNANCE

- Access to data under competition law (merger control, essential facilities and input foreclosure)
- Regulatory initiatives to facilitate data sharing and reuse between businesses, from the public to the private sector, and vice versa
- The governance of data sharing

DYNAMIC PRICING

- Algorithmic collusion
- The legality of personalised pricing under competition law and regulation (consumer protection, data protection, non-discrimination rules)
